INSPIRED WORD February 12, 2020

SCRIPTURE

From **Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14**: As I looked, thrones were set in place and the Ancient of Days took his seat. His clothing was as white as snow, and the hair of his head was white as wool. His throne was flaming with fire, and its wheels were all ablaze. A river of fire was flowing, coming out from before him. Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated and the books were opened. WORD OF KNOWLEDGE / SCRIPTURE

This goes along with what was just said but I was given this scripture earlier and I believe it's for someone here. It's from **Psalm 91:4-5**: He will cover you with his wings; you will be safe in his care. His faithfulness will protect and defend you. You need not fear any dangers of night or sudden attacks during the day.

CONFIRMATION / SCRIPTURE

I confirm that because I was given **Psalm 27:4-6**: One thing I ask of the Lord, this is what I seek; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple. For in the day of trouble, he will keep me safe in his dwelling. He will hide me in the shelter of his tabernacle and set me high upon on rock. Then my head will be exalted above the enemies who surround me. At his tabernacle I will sacrifice with shouts of joy. I will sing and make music to the Lord.

SCRIPTURE

And this goes along with it from **Revelation 3:20-21**: Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any one hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter his house and dine with him and he with me. I will give the victor the right to sit with me on my throne, as I myself first won the victory and sit with my Father on his throne.

SCRIPTURE

Praise him with the blast of the trumpet; praise him with the lyre and harp! Praise him with the timbrel and dance; praise him with strings and pipe! CONFIRMATION / SCRIPTURE

SCRIPTURE

From the **Song of Solomon:8:7**: *Many waters cannot quench love, neither can floods drown it.* And a little bit before that **(v. 5)**: *Who is that coming up from the wilderness leaning upon her beloved?* The person leaning on the beloved is... set their eyes upon Jesus, the beautiful.

SCRIPTURE / SHARING

I've just had a real sense from the beginning of the word "the good shepherd" and was wondering if this is just me or is this...? Then there's only been like 15 scriptures that have confirmed it. But from **Psalm 23**, it's the sense of the Shepherd as protector. "Even though I walk in the dark valley, I fear no evil for you are at my side; your rod and your staff are there to guide me. You prepare a table before me in the sight of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil and my cup flows over" (vs. 4-5). But it was just that sense of the Shepherd who doesn't take away the danger but He walks through the danger with us and protects us through that. And the image that went with that is a little bit stark but my niece is a shepherd. She raises lambs and they've been having trouble with coyotes, and they're killing sheep. And so she got a new gun for her birthday and is taking care of the problem as necessary. But it's out of love for her sheep; she protects her sheep. And God walks with us to protect us; He doesn't just leave us to the wolves.

SCRIPTURE

The Word was the Lord and the Word dwelt among us (John 1:14).

SCRIPTURE

My word was from **Ezekiel 36:22-28**: Therefore say to the house of Israel, thus says the Lord God: I do not do this for your sake, O house of Israel, but for my holy name's sake which you have profaned among the nations wherever you went. And I will sanctify my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, and which you have profaned in their midst. I am the Lord, and the nations shall know that I am the Lord, says the Lord God, when I am hallowed in you before their eyes, for I will take you from among the nations, gather you out of all

countries, and bring you into your own land. Then I will sprinkle clean water upon you and you shall be clean. I will cleanse you from all your filthiness and from all your idols. I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you. I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you and cause you to walk in my statutes and you will keep my judgments and do them. Then you shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers.
