PRAYER

SENSE

The sense that I get of that image is that the Lord invites us from time to time to just take a seat and to be still and to be quiet and to let Him be our God. But in our busyness, we use that chair for other things than to be still and to be quiet. We let our work interfere with that quietness sometimes, our concerns interfere with that quietness, and the Lord is encouraging us to put aside, some of the time, the concerns, the work that we have, the things that we have

to do and to just sit quietly and let Him be our God. Just sit quietly and allow that time to be His.

CONFIRMATION / SCRIPTURE

In confirmation of that, I kept getting the **Song of Solomon 1:4**, and in the first poem of that scripture, it says, "Draw me in your footsteps; let us roam. The king has brought me into his rooms. You will be our joy and our gladness. We shall praise your love more than wine. How right it is to love you." And there's that sense of intimacy with God, of being drawn to His rooms, to that inner place where He waits, where He calls, where the chair is waiting for us as much as it is waiting for Him. There's a song that a friend of mine used to sing, which is a version of this, and it says, "Draw me, O King. I will follow you eagerly." I feel like the Lord's calling us into His presence.
