**SCRIPTURE**

**Psalms 100: 1 – 5:** Shout joyfully to the Lord, all you lands; worship the Lord with cries of gladness; come before Him with joyful song. Know that the Lord is God, our Maker to Whom we belong, Whose people we are, God’s well-tended flock. Enter the temple gates with praise, its courts with thanksgiving. Give thanks to God, bless His name; good indeed is the Lord, Whose love endures forever, Whose faithfulness lasts through every age.

**PRAYER**

Lord, that reality is marvelous that You pour forth Your love upon us and we are changed by it. Our hearts just respond to it. O Jesus, thank You for Your salvation, thank You for Your mercy, thank You for Your love! Jesus, Jesus, we thank You!

**SCRIPTURE**

**Psalms 144: 1 – 2:** “Blessed be the Lord, my Rock, Who trains my hands for battle, my fingers for war; my Safeguard and my Fortress, my Stronghold, my Deliverer, my Shield, in Whom I trust, Who subdues peoples under me.” What a promise! While we experience the enemy, we don’t have to be afraid of them because the Lord is our Shield and Deliverer and He makes them submit to us.

**EXHORTATION**

Let’s take a few minutes and just ask the Lord to refresh our minds, our souls, and most importantly to refresh our hearts; to be able to make that connection between head and heart.

**PROPHECY / EXHORTATION**

There is a song that is in my mind and the lyrics are: “Draw me close, closer than before, closer than I have ever been; draw me close, closer than I have been before, closer than I have ever been.” Sometimes, I think that in the middle of our dancing in the river, we start to realize how deep it is and we start to doubt and fear. But I really think that the Lord is saying, “Come on, let

Me draw you closer, let Me draw you close to My Heart, let Me allow you to hear and feel My heartbeat which echoes, "I love you; I love you; I love you; I love you." So when things are building up around us and it starts to feel almost like it is too much, remind yourselves of the heartbeat of the Father and the words, "Come on, let Me draw you closer, closer than you have ever been before, let Me draw you close!"

### **INTERPRETATION / PROPHECY**

It is a river that flows from My very Throne room. There is a river that flows from My very Throne room and it starts with My heart. It is the heart that you heard beating for you to come close, and it is a river of grace, a river of love, and a river of mercy. When you step into that river, you experience My love, My grace and My mercy. And I say to you, "Do not be afraid to step into My river!
